

Problem Statement

McKinsey & Company Report

Black business owners have been disproportionately affected by the pandemic-linked economic downturn, partly because they were more likely to already be in a precarious position, including more likely to be located in communities with business environments that are more likely to produce poor business outcomes. Indeed, about 58% of Black-owned businesses were at risk of financial distress before the pandemic, compared with about 27% of white-owned businesses. The pandemic contributed to tipping 41% of Black-owned US businesses into closure from February to April 2020. More than 50% of the owners of surviving Black businesses surveyed in May reported being very or extremely concerned about the viability of their businesses. This concern may be linked to having a more difficult time accessing credit since the COVID-19 crisis began; 36% of Black business owners responding to the survey said they had experienced this, compared with 29% of all respondents. 


